### Please Read the Information Below before Applying:

The School of Music Student Ambassadors are a small group of students majoring in different areas. Ambassadors are involved in recruiting students through assisting with auditions, campus tours, college fairs and the School of Music Open House as well as emails to prospective students, blogging, and posts to the School of Music Facebook site. (More details on specific duties are below.)

### Requirements:

- Ambassadors must have completed 30 hours of course work with at least a 3.0 GPA at the end of the spring semester.
- Applicants must be full-time, degree-seeking undergraduate music students.
- Ambassadors are expected to be responsible, honest, respectful, communicative, and to represent the School of Music to the best of their abilities.

Ambassadors are required to volunteer a minimum of 40 hours per year to be awarded a \$300 scholarship at the end of the year (2 semester term). Those who earn more than required 40 hours of service in a year will be awarded \$400 for the year.

#### Duties will include:

- Assisting with:
  - o School of Music audition days (several Saturdays in January-February)
  - o School of Music Open House (Sunday in April)
  - o UT Open House (two Saturdays in the fall)
  - o Scholars Invitational days (usually 3-4 Monday and Fridays in October)
  - Other School of Music and UT recruitment days/fairs
- Regularly checking the Music Admissions database for student wanting to visit UT. Contacting visiting students, setting up their visit schedule, assisting in their visit.

There will be a mid-semester evaluation of each Ambassador. Ambassadors may be dismissed for not reaching their volunteer hour requirement or for not living up to the expectations of the position.

In order to be selected for a second or third year, the Ambassadors must meet the minimum expectations and fulfill the responsibilities previously listed. They must also exceed those expectations by being a team player, and demonstrating personal initiative, leadership abilities, and commitment to the School of Music and the Ambassador program.

The Ambassador will be provided with a School of Music polo shirt, which they will wear at all events, unless otherwise specified.
